**"Just Because My Path is Different Doesn't Mean I'm Lost"**



The South Carolina Developmental Disabilities Council was established in 1971 by Executive Order of the Governor and was reauthorized in 2010 **and again in 2015**. Not less than 60% of the total Council membership is consumers and family members. Additional members come from state agencies, DD Act partners and non-governmental organizations.

The Council is federally funded under the Developmental Disabilities Act. The Council engages in activities that contribute to a coordinated, consumer and family centered and directed, comprehensive system that includes needed community services, individualized supports and other forms of assistance that promote self-determination for individuals with developmental disabilities and their families. The mission of the South Carolina Developmental Disabilities Council is to provide leadership in planning, funding, and implementing initiatives that lead to improved quality of life for people with developmental disabilities and their families through advocacy, capacity building, and systemic change. In 2015, the South Carolina Developmental Disabilities Council brought Partners in Policymaking® in house. In the past five years we have had four graduation classes 19, 20, 21, and 22.

In March 2020 when COVID-19 hit, we were challenged to find alternative means to serve the disability community during the pandemic. Since we couldn't do big gatherings during the pandemic, we had to think outside of the box and be creative. This led to using virtual sessions to connect with everyone in the disability community.

We have done some virtual sessions with film maker and director Dan Habib and his son Samuel Habib that talk about

- Person-centered planning/student-driven IEPs
- Self-Advocacy/self-determination strategies and leadership development
- Inclusive education
- Community-based experiences such as extended learning opportunities, internships, work study, and apprenticeships
- Paid work experience and entrepreneurship development
- Family involvement and high expectations
- Higher education opportunities and supports



Also, we will be starting new virtual sessions on leadership and affecting change in our communities. The first session will begin on October 29<sup>th</sup> [https://bit.ly/leader\\_skills](https://bit.ly/leader_skills) and the second session will be November 18<sup>th</sup> <https://bit.ly/advocacy>
